She recruited and introduced into the UK the availability of retired Law Lords and Judges of the Court of Appeal and High Court, to provide private resolution of legal matters, using highly skilled Mediators and Arbitrators.

As a Mediator, helping parties to consider the risks and benefits of negotiating settlement, Frances is able to draw on her extensive knowledge of law and procedure gained through her professional background.

Frances is able to mediate over a wide range of family issues generally, with particular specialism in Family Property and Finance (including Inheritance and Cohabitants' rights) and Family Business issues.
